

Easy berth, high and dry

FOR boaties, one of the attractions of waterfront living is having the boat moored at the back of the house, ready to go at very short notice.

The downside is that boats left in the water require more maintenance.

In the warm waters of the Gold Coast for example, it takes only a few days for marine growth to begin establishing itself on boat hulls.

The AirBerth Boat Lift is one system that was designed to get the boat out of the water without losing the convenience of having it ready to go with a minimum of fuss.

AirBerth uses the buoyancy of air to raise the boat out of the

water, and takes less than five minutes to have it back in there and ready to get going.

Lifting the boat is a matter of pulling a handle, with a rope and pulley system taking the load out of the job.

A weights system makes lowering the boat similarly easy, with the boat being lowered stern first into the water.

Built of high-density, UV-resistant polyethylene, the system has a projected design life span of 50 years, and is suitable for boats from 15 to 46ft long and up to 10 tonnes.

AirBerth can accommodate shaft drives, stern drives, twin outboards and catamarans.
